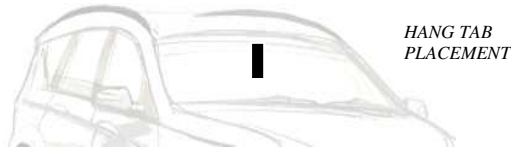


**UNIVERSITY AREA
CONTROLLED VEHICULAR PARKING PROGRAM
2008-2009**

On-street parking within delineated Parking Program Zones is restricted to neighborhood residents, businesses and visitors. A City of Gainesville PERMIT is required for parking in the Program Zone Monday through Friday from 7:00 am to 5:00 pm. Permits are valid from the date of issue to September 30th, 2009. The City of Gainesville parking permits are ZONE SPECIFIC.

ZONE 8

Permit is a hang tab that must be displayed on the rear view mirror facing the front of the vehicle. Failure to properly display the permit may result in a citation.



COMMERCIAL PERMITS

Issued to businesses in the area, permit is a hang tab that must be displayed on the rear view mirror facing the front of the vehicle. Permit is Zone Specific. Failure to properly display the permit may result in a citation.

SERVICE VEHICLE PERMITS

Issued to service vehicles (i.e., lawn care, plumbing), permit is a hang tab that must be displayed on the rear view mirror facing the front of the vehicle. Permit is valid in all Program Zones. Failure to properly display the permit may result in a citation.

ENFORCEMENT

Traffic Technicians are assigned to the program areas Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM for the purpose of issuing citations to violators. Those found in violation of Ordinance 26 – 47(a)(3)b will be issued a citation. Illegal use of permit may be subject to a penalty (see Code of Ordinance Appendix A).

LOST/STOLEN PERMITS

If permit is lost, stolen or damaged, proof must be submitted of permit purchase (i.e., receipt or copy of application). The old permit will be voided. A citation will be issued each time a voided permit is found in use. There will be a replacement fee (see Code of Ordinances Appendix A).

APPEALS BOARD

The Appeals Board will:

1. Hear appeals from property owners, managers or other affected individuals who allege a hardship is created by the regulations due to unique conditions associated with their property or its residents;
2. Reinstate revoked decals or permits.

**My permit has been revoked.
How do I appeal?**

Submit appeal in writing to the City within 10 days of receipt of notification of revocation of privileges, and pay a fee. If the decal or permit is reinstated the fee will be refunded in full. If the Board revokes the decal or permit for the remainder of the program year, appellant must return the decal or permit to the City, and pay a Reinstatement Fee for the next program year.
