Proposal	About
Payments for Vaccination	Amount: \$100,000 Description: This is for direct payments to community members who become vaccinated. Other communities (and states) have had success in this approach, and it is one we should engage and partner with the county on. The total amount to be paid to each neighbor should be left to staff to determine. The program should be delivered in east Gainesville locations to directly address vaccination in minority communities.
Mental Health Vouchers	Amount: \$500,000 Description: Low cost/and or no cost mental health assistance with a focus on culturally and ethnically compatible therapists.
CRP Program Expansion	Amount: \$3 Million Description: Expansion of our Community Resource Paramedicine Program
CRP	Amount: \$600,000 Description: This would be an enhancement of the CRP by helping them acquire equipment and resources to expand services.
Community Resource Paramedics	Amount: \$2 Million Description: This existing city program identifies our neighbors who make frequent use of our 911 system and develops a health plan to specifically address each person's specific needs.
Community Resource Paramedic Program	Amount: \$1,250,000 Description: This is a direct investment in building capacity for the CRP program that directly serves low- and very-low-income at-risk neighbors.
Eastside Medical Center	Amount: Unknown at this time Description: Fund a health clinic in East Gainesville in partnership with UF and Alachua County
Eastside Medical Campus	Amount: \$2.5 Million Description: Partnering with Alachua County to Fund the construction of a medical facility near the _____ property, to be operated by UF health.
Funding for the UF Health Site	Amount: \$2 Million Description: This funding would go toward the capital costs of UF building a health facility on the east side.

Eastside Mobility Hub	Amount: \$2 Million in year 2 Description: A mobility hub in East Gainesville to help decrease commute times for individuals who live in East Gainesville
Vision Zero Capital Implementation	Amount: \$1 million year 1 / \$1 million year 2 Description: Implement capital projects that will help with the vision zero goal.
Broadband Expansion	Amount: \$15 million over 2 years Description: Expansion of city owned Fiber internet to census designated low income neighborhoods, and to Gainesville Housing Authority owned properties. The city would provide low cost high speed fiber internet to homes and businesses it connects to. Also, properties owned by the Gainesville Housing Authority would receive 100% subsidized internet.
Broadband	Amount: \$13 Million Description: Invest in broadband infrastructure.
Affordable, Robust and Universal Broadband Access	Amount: \$900,000 Description: This is a direct investment in building policy or physical infrastructure for delivery of broadband services. Any direct delivery of broadband resources through this fund should be for economically-disadvantaged neighborhoods, and at least 1/3 of the fund should go to that purpose.
East Side Grocery Store	Amount: \$3.3 million Description: The city helping to fund a grocery store in East Gainesville
Eastside food facility	Amount: \$3 million Description: Assist in bringing a full service grocery store to east GNV.
Citizen's Field Upgrades	Amount: \$5M+ Description: The Citizen's Field location has been considered for WSPP funding to transform the land into a modern day destination with mixed uses. Due to rising construction costs the WSPP budget no longer can guarantee the completion of this project. ARP funding could guarantee the project's success.
Climate Action Plan Fund	Amount: \$1,000,000 Description: The City Commission has authorized the creation of a Nature Policies Subcommittee to discuss how to implement a 17 point plan to address climate change and environmental justice. This fund could be used to jumpstart many of these goals yet to be designated in budget or order by the City Commission.
Fire Station 1 Refurbishment	Amount: \$2,100,000 Description: UF's proposal to operate a first class community center at the old Fire Station 1 site is a

	<p>transformational project opportunity. We currently do not have a funding source identified, so ARP funds are a perfect solution.</p>
Glen Springs Purchase	<p>Amount: \$2,000,000 Description: Creating unique best in class public parks improves everyone’s quality of life. During pandemic quarantine it was our parks and natural conservation land that gave people refuge. Glen Springs has long been unattainable because of the high purchase price from an unwilling seller. I believe this once in a lifetime funding can be used to create another oasis for our neighbors.</p>
Infinity Loop	<p>Amount: \$3,000,000 Description: The Infinity Loop is a project I moved for analysis in my first term of office. The IL will connect our North/South bicycle and pedestrian trails throughout Gainesville. Much like our parks and natural spaces, cycling was a refuge for residents during the pandemic quarantine. Enhancing this connectivity will improve mobility for residents and provide another outlet for community enrichment.</p>
SW Gainesville Park	<p>Amount: TBD Description: SW Gainesville does not offer an active recreation city park. This causes kids who want to play to look elsewhere, either traveling long distances or in places they are not allowed. Earmarking funding for a park in this area will be a huge boost to the area.</p>
Improving the City’s Built Environment	<p>Amount: \$4,500,000 Description: This will directly address support for recovery in the downtown hospitality industry and road safety by providing funds to: Redesign and rebuild SW 1st Avenue as a pedestrian mall, \$2,000,000. Fund redesign of currently dangerous roadways in our community in safe, complete streets models, \$2,500,000.</p>
SW 1 st Ave Pedestrian Street	<p>Amount: \$2,000,000 Description: Turn SW 1st Ave between Main Street and SW 2nd street into a permanent pedestrian only area. Also, create local small minority owned business kiosks that can be rented. This also would create a destination place downtown to help drive traffic in to help local businesses</p>
